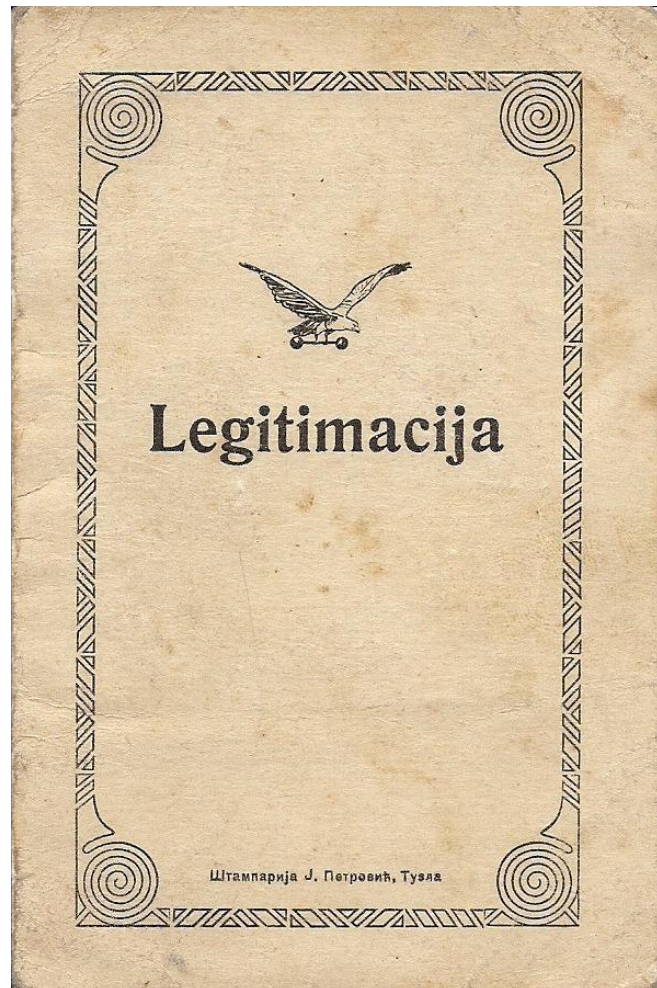

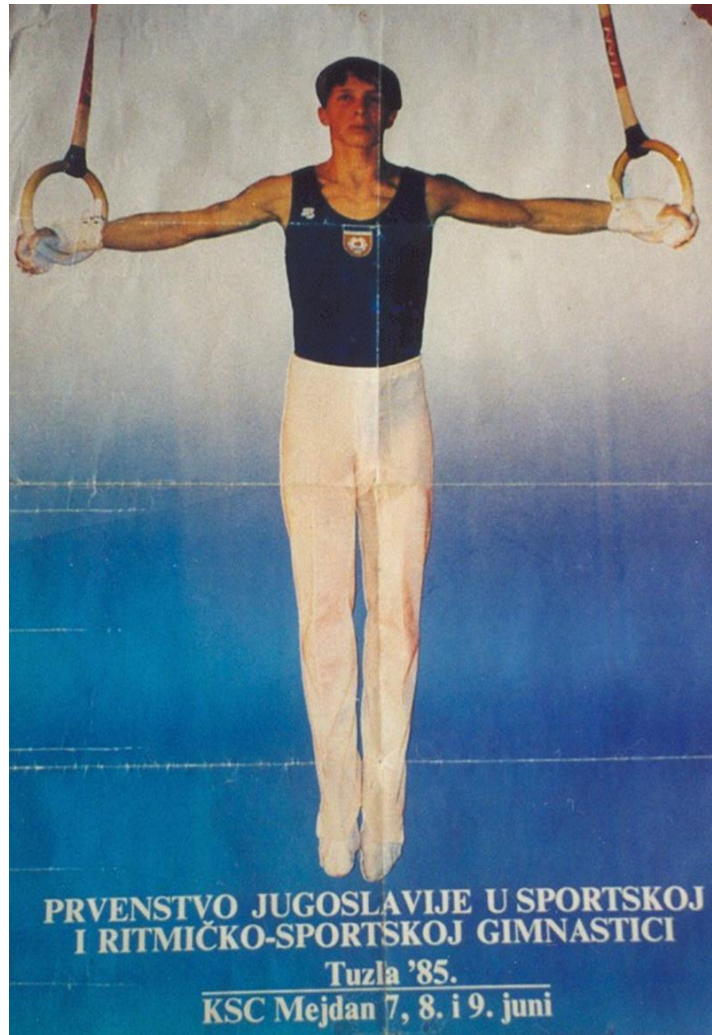

The arena suffered substantial damage and was completely destroyed by **shelling, bombing and fire by the aggressor forces on Monday, May 25, 1992** during the Bosnian War.

The remaining areas of the structure, such as the basements, were put into **service as a morgue and as storage space for medication and supplies.**

The **wooden seats from the venue were used as material for coffins for civilians killed in the war.**

Reconstruction Zetra



After the war, it was discovered that though the building was badly damaged, the foundation was secure. Although the original blueprints were never recovered, in September 1997, reconstruction on the venue, facilitated by the SFOR, began.

The International Olympic Committee donated \$US 11.5 million to the project, which cost an estimated DM 32 million (€ 16.4 million).

The reconstruction was completed in 1999.

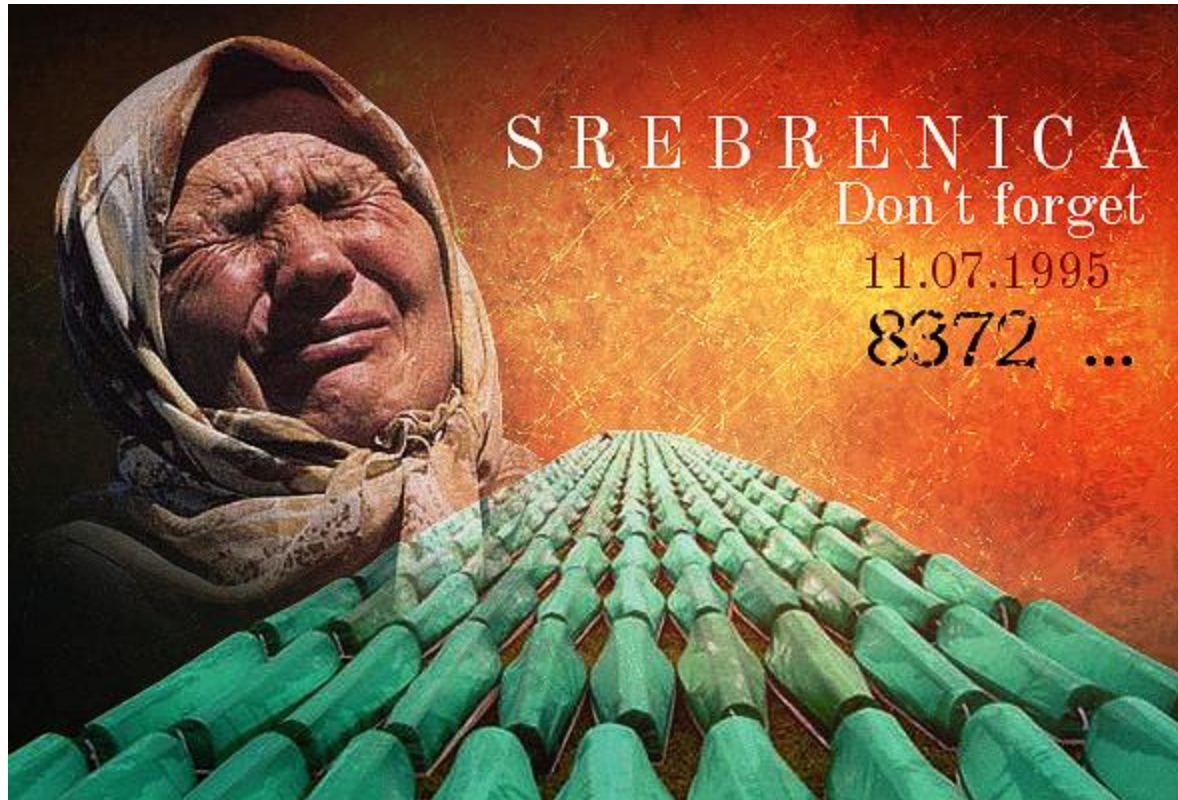

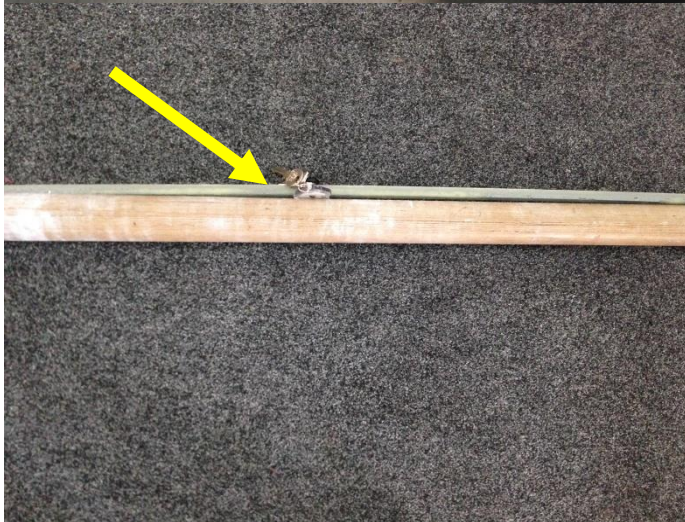

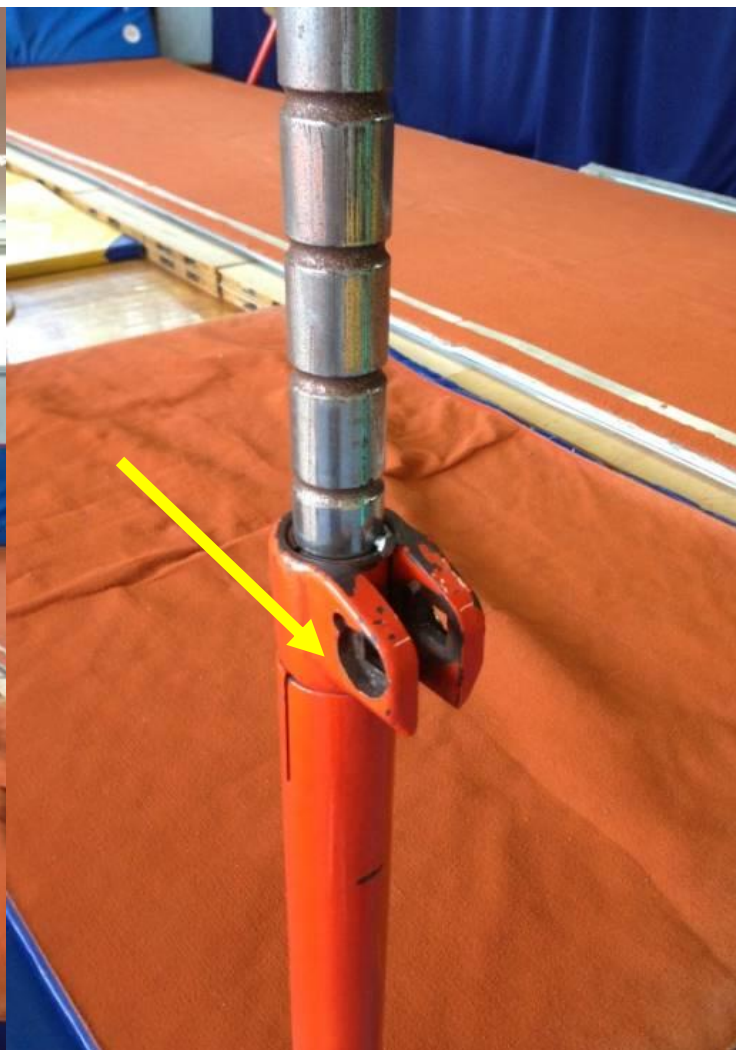
